LATEST MATCH REPORT

13th September 2025: Wolverhampton Casuals 1-2 Stockport Georgians

Wolverhampton Casuals again fell to a narrow 2-1 defeat against Stockport Georgians, but the Cassies showed some grit, resilience and quality in a game disrupted by a serious injury and a long stoppage.

The visitors struck early, McFadyen delivering a deep cross for Flynn to head home in the 3rd minute. Not for the first time this season, a very early goal has influenced the game.

However, within minutes, they had responded in style: after going close from a Taylor corner through Kourouyianni, the equaliser arrived on 8 minutes. A perfectly timed through ball split the Georgians' defence, and Letford showed composure beyond measure, slotting coolly into the far corner to bring the sides level.

Unfortunately, the game was halted in the 16th minute when Stockport full-back Steve Macsween suffered a nasty knee injury. After a lengthy stoppage of nearly an hour, play eventually resumed, and the Casuals were the side who looked sharper. Hesketh twice went close with efforts from distance, one flashing narrowly wide and another skimming the post from a free kick. Pressure continued from Taylor's set pieces, but the visitors' defence held firm.

After the restart, Stockport briefly enjoyed a spell of pressure, but Oseland in the Casuals' goal stood tall to deal comfortably with Flynn's effort. At the other end, the Cassies looked the more likely to break the deadlock. Hesketh forced Piper into a fingertip save from another well-struck free kick, before Coster's instinctive first-time effort from the resulting corner just cleared the bar.

Against the run of play, the decisive moment came in the 66th minute when Winthrop capitalised on a defensive slip and finished past Oseland to make it 2-1 to Stockport. Wolverhampton Casuals heads dropped at the thought of yet another fight to try and claim a point. They looked for openings but nothing materialised, they denied Stockport any further chances and showed that they can compete toe-to-toe with any side in the division, but conceding early goals is a habit that they need to get rid off.

On another day, with the fine margins going their way, the Cassies could easily have taken something from this contest. The Cassies need to nurture their belief, attacking intent and togetherness and those qualities will no doubt bear fruit as the season progresses.

Telford Town Football Club is an English football club from Telford, Shropshire. The club plays in the North West Counties League Division One South and were formerly known as Wellington Amateurs. After many years in the Wellington League, the team was promoted to the Shropshire County Football League. They were promoted to the West Midlands (Regional) League in 2006. "The Ams" won Division One three times in four seasons and gained promotion to the Premier Division for 2012-13. In 2024 the club was taken over by former Hednesford Town owner Hayden Dando and renamed Telford Town Football Club.

In the 2024/25 season the club won a treble lifting the West Midlands (Regional) League Premier Division in 2024/25 losing just once all season, being unbeaten at home, scoring 94 goals and conceding just 15. Retaining the Powell Cup beating Haughmond in the final on penalties after a 0-0 draw before going on to lift the Shropshire Challenge Cup against Dawley Town 2-1 with goals from Jordan Jones and Rune Corinaldi.

LATEST MATCH REPORT

16th September 2025: Haughmond 2-3 Wolverhampton Casuals

Wolverhampton Casuals secured their first away victory of the season with a hard-fought 3-2 win at Haughmond, delivering a performance full of spirit, quality, and determination.

The Cassies made a dream start, moving the ball with confidence and purpose. Their early dominance was rewarded in the 5th minute when Coster rose highest to meet Chilton's pinpoint cross, guiding a fine header into the net to put Casuals ahead.

Barely five minutes later, Casuals struck again. Once more Chilton provided the delivery, and this time it was Swingwood who powered a header past the goalkeeper to double the lead, leaving Haughmond stunned. Casuals were dominant and had a number of openings to go further ahead the best of which was from Swingwood who broke through on goal but his final touch was too strong and the ball ran to the keeper to collect.

However, the third did arrive on 31 minutes, the Cassies were in complete control. A sweeping move opened space for Letford, who coolly finished to make it 3-0 and underline the visitors' attacking dominance. Haughmond responded in the 38th minute, with Pickford stealing in unmarked at the back post to head home and reduce the deficit before the break.

The Cassies started well in the second half with Parker's 47th minute strike tipped onto the bar by Jones in the Haughmond goal. However, The hosts grew in confidence and 55th minute Pickford struck again, to bring the score back to 3-2 with a direct free kick into the top corner from 18 yards. With half an hour left to play, the game looked set for a tense finale.

But the Cassies showed resilience and discipline. Digging deep, they defended bravely, soaked up the pressure, and battled for every ball to ensure the points would head back to Wolverhampton.

At the final whistle, it was a richly deserved win for the Cassies — their first away triumph of the campaign, built on an electric start, clinical finishing, and sheer determination to see the job through.

Club History.

The earliest records show that the club began as Wolverhampton Old Church F.C. based in the Fighting Cocks in 1899, in the Penn area of Wolverhampton. In 1914, the club changed its name to Wolverhampton Amateurs and played at Langley Road and Beckminster Playing Fields. In 1946, the club merged with Old Wulfrunians club to form a gentleman's sporting club to provide a whole range of sporting teams. The club's name was changed to Staffordshire Casuals and although the liaison with the Old Wulfs was short lived, the Staffordshire Casuals continued as a football team and established a new base at Bantock Park.

The 50s saw the Staffordshire Casuals as the most successful team in the Birmingham AFA League, winning the league three years in succession and being cup winners in several competitions. During the late 50s the Casuals moved to Aldersley Stadium and also spent a short time at Codsall playing fields, before they purchased their current home ground at Brinsford Lane in Coven Heath in c1970. Another era of tremendous success coincided with the move to the club's own ground. After being one of the founder members of the Birmingham AFA and winning the Premier Division of that league in 1980/81, Wolverhampton Casuals applied to join the West Midlands League. They were elected to Division 2 in 1981/82 and after two seasons, were promoted to Division 1 for the 1984/85 season. The following three years were tremendously successful, the club finished as runners-up in three consecutive seasons and were winners of the Division 1 Cup and Walsall Senior Cup in 1985/86. On the back of these three seasons and the club finally meeting the ground requirements, the Casuals were promoted to the West Midlands League Premier Division in 1987/88. Unfortunately after two seasons, the requirement for clubs to have floodlights forced the Casuals back down to Division 1 for the 1991/92 season.

After winning Division 1 in 1994/95, the club played at Aldersley Stadium for two seasons whilst ground improvements were made and floodlights installed at Brinsford Lane. In 1997/98, the Casuals won the Staffs Vase and came runners up the following season whilst also reaching the league cup semi final. In 2000/01, the club won their most prestigious trophy to date by beating Sutton Town to win the Walsall Senior Cup. This was followed by more success the following season with the club finishing third and again reaching the league cup semi final.

The rest of the decade saw the club finishing in the lower half of the table before a welcome change started to take place as the club reached the West Midlands Premier League cup final in 2010/11 before finishing third in the league for the following three seasons, including being runners up in the JW Hunt Cup final in 2012/13. Respectable sixth placed finishes came in 2014/15 and 2015/16 before a second placed finish in 2016/17 became Casuals highest ever league position. 2018/19 was another successful year as the Casuals finished third in the league and also won the league cup.

The Casuals were high-flying and well placed for promotion in seasons 2019/20 and 2020/21 before the Covid pandemic brought a premature end to both seasons. In 2021/22 due to an NLS restructure and based on PPG over the previous seasons, Casuals were promoted to the Midland Football League Premier Division, their first time at Step 5 which is the highest level in the club's history. Adam Pearce took the reins as manager for this period and oversaw three seasons of survival before stepping away at the end of the 2023/24 season. Former youth team manager, Chris Hipkin, took the job for the 2024/25 and despite a valiant effort, an injury stricken Casuals were relegated back to Step 6. A turbulent summer for the club saw them allocated to the North West Counties Football League for the first time, despite an FA appeal, and the club now look forward to a new challenge in the North West.

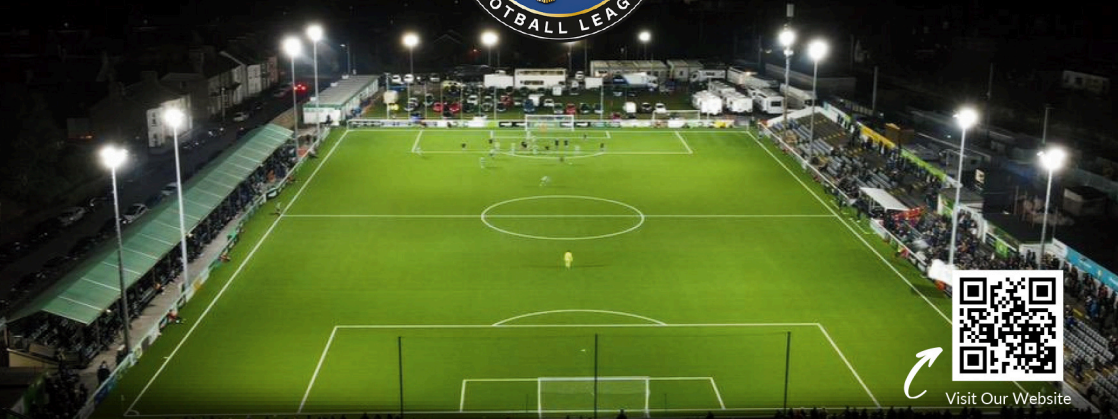
